..your brother here was dead and has come to life

Following a transition in the lifestyle of the people of God, the parable of Jesus in the Gospel uses food as the vehicle of narration. The time the younger son lived with his father, he lived in comfortable circumstances. He became selfish and did not see the good the father was doing to him by providing him all his needs. The decision to request his part of his inheritance even before the death of his father was a wicked one. His resolution to separate himself from his father and the rest of his family shows that he had no consideration for his personal responsibility toward the family. He thought his inheritance would provide him food for all his life. He did not realise that he was not experienced in managing wealth properly. The parable makes clear that the young man came to his senses only because he lacked food. We would have thought that



the period of hunger would have been the occasion for him to reflect on his life and repent the wrong he did by asking for his inheritance when his father was still alive. On the contrary, his reflection was limited to the contrast between the life his father's servants and what he was experiencing in the distant land. It would seem that he was not conscious of the gravity of his own action. This observation is however tone down by his demand for pardon when he acknowledged that he had sinned against his father and against God. The reaction of the father

younger son surprises many people. He did not show any sign of anger despite the son's action that halved his property. He was more concerned about the safe return of the son. The reaction of the father may be seen by some people as tacitly lauding the action of his son. Far from that, we need to look at the merciful attitude of the father. The question that the action of lesus raises is a pertinent and complicated one. How can we bring sinners to God if we do not seek their company? How do we let sinners know that God is a loving and merciful father who awaits our return? How do we let sinners know that though their sins are many, the Lord would cleanse them and make them a new creation? May we use this Lenten season for our own repentance and engage ourselves in bringing back sinners to their Father's house.
