

God is merciful to all

God is merciful to all because he loves all he has made

"You love all that exists, you hold nothing of what you have made in abhorrence ... you spare all things because all things are yours, Lord, lover of life ... little by little, therefore, you correct those who offend, you admonish them and remind them of how they have sinned, so that they may abstain from evil and trust in you, Lord". Written about 50 years before Christ was born, the Book of Wisdom is some of the New Testament theology of Jesus. We tend to think of Zacchaeus as a funny

background for little man who climbed a tree. He was a chief tax collector, a collaborator

with the occupiers and loathsome to the crowd who saw him welcoming lesus. He wanted to see what kind of man Jesus was. He didn't realise what Jesus was doing when he stopped at the tree and invited himself to stay. The Son of Man had come to seek out Zacchaeus and to save him who was lost. Zacchaeus's response

was joyful and generous: half giving his (substantial) property to the poor and paying back at the maximum rate demanded by the Torah any profit made shady practice. "Today salvation has come to this house". Zacchaeus was a changed man.

'Over the next few months, you may notice changes in how we display flowers in the church, using more vases, new containers and different plant materials. We are aware that the flower industry has a poor environmental record, including the continued use of imported flowers and floral foam, commonly known as Oasis, which is a by-product of the petrochemical industry. As a group, we are working to reduce our environmental impact and will be using different mechanics to display flowers in the Church as well as exploring more local sources of flowers and materials. I am grateful to my team of arrangers for their support in making these changes and as we learn new ways to work with flowers, we are sure that the people of the Parish will continue to appreciate the beauty that flowers bring to our church and our spiritual life.'
