Journey through Lent

On Wednesday many of us attended Mass and received ashes traced in the Sign of the Cross onto our foreheads. The words used, "Repent and believe the Good News" are taken from the words Jesus spoke at the start of his ministry. Lent calls us to repent and live our lives more in line with the example Jesus gives us and to have hope in the gifts that He brings to us.

Lent reflects the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert avoiding temptations. We will not find ourselves tempted in the same way as Jesus this Lent but there will be times when we have to decide between doing what is selfless and what is not! Jesus encourages us to make loving choices that bring us closer to each other and closer to God.

There are three pillars to help our Lenten journey: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. During Lent we are called to grow closer to God in our prayer life by remembering to spend part of everyday with Him. By fasting (giving something up) during Lent we also draw closer to God by focussing on the things that are truly important in our Life. We are also called to serve others, particularly the poor and those in need of our support. This is the time to truly welcome others into our community and show genuine kindness and hospitality to those around us.

In the parish this Lent, we will be hosting a Week of Guided Prayer to help us drawer closer to God. This will take place from 12-18 March. The week offers the great opportunity to meet a personal guide each day and to share thoughts that have arisen in prayer. Further details can be found in the newsletter.
