We Are Promised An Eternal Reward

As Gospel readings at Mass for this Sunday and the two preceding Sundays we have the 'mission discourse' in chapter 10 of the Gospel according to St Matthew. The discourse opens with the commissioning of the named twelve apostles, a mission expressly limited to the 'lost sheep of the house of Israel'. At the end of Matthew's Gospel,



Whoever is not willing to carry the cross and follow Me is not worthy of Me. Matthew 10:38

Ch 28:19-20, however, Jesus tells the eleven remaining apostles to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

As the mission discourse develops through Mt 10 there are warnings about coming persecution before governors and kings, the command not to be afraid of those who can kill the body but not the soul, and the prediction of strife within and outside families caused by following Jesus. This Sunday we hear of the requirement to love Jesus even more than one's own family members; to take up one's own cross and follow Jesus, prepared to lose one's life rather than denying him; and the description of the rewards for those who receive Jesus's disciples hospitably. Nearly all of the eleven did indeed meet persecution and martyrdom as followers of Jesus.

The warnings, encouragement and advice we hear in this Sunday's gospel reading were equally applicable to later generations of Jesus's disciples as they spread Jesus's message throughout the world. They apply to us too, as baptised members of his Church. They are demanding, even in this country. If we willingly receive Jesus's messengers, we are promised an eternal reward.
