Being reconciled with God

In today's First Reading God, speaking through the prophet Ezekiel, says that the appointed leader must speak out against evil. If he or she fails to do this the wicked man will die for his sin, but the leader who failed to speak out will be held responsible for his death. This is a salutary - and alarming - warning to those of us who are priests, but also to parents, teachers, catechists, and those involved in the police and justice system.

In speaking out against evil, however, we must act and speak with prudence; a harsh condemnation may be counter productive in some situations; we have to find the right way and the right words to convince a wicked person to change. Speaking against evil does not mean being aggressive or offensive.

The Psalm recalls the disobedience of the ancestors; 'Meribah' means 'strife' and 'Massah' means 'testing'. Instead of complaining we should obey God ('listen to his voice').

St Paul in the Second Reading echoes the teaching of Christ that love is the fulfilling of the law, and he lists the very sins about which Jesus speaks in the Gospel. In today's Gospel Christ speaks forthrightly about the effect of unrepented sin on the community of faith. We tend to think of sin - and therefore forgiveness as well - as personal. But every sin badly wounds the whole community, the Church. This is why we call Confession the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for by it we are reconciled not only with God but also with the Church (and, incidentally, with the people we have sinned against).

So, if you have not been to Confession for a while, what is stopping you? Don't forget: the priest is a sinner too and goes to Confession. Consider these words of St Augustine: 'In failing to confess, Lord, I would only hide You from myself, not myself from You.'

The ultimate sanction against a sinner is exclusion, being treated like a pagan or tax collector. This is, perhaps, rare in the modern church, though it occasionally happens. We would rather persuade the sinner to repent, bearing in mind the First Reading. We want everyone to be with God in eternal bliss in heaven, we don't want anyone to end up in another place. For the designated 7 days volunteers are needed for tasks like cooking/serving dinners & breakfasts, sleeping over in the Lower Hall, driving luggage, doing laundry. Even if you could do one of those tasks just once, it would be greatly appreciated (current valid DBS check required). Finance is needed for grocery shopping for food & toiletries etc. There will be a special collection after all Masses on 24 September.
