*"...unless you forgive others from your heart."
Mt 18:35*



For the past Sundays, Peter's voice has been heard consistently. Sometimes, he gets it right; but other times he gets it wrong. His faith journey shows to us the Christian life in Baptism. Sometimes the way is smooth and easy; but other times, it is steep and difficult.

One aspect of this challenge is addressed in today's gospel when Peter openly asks Jesus 'how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Instead of answering Peter directly, Jesus as usual tells a story. One clear mes-

sage emerges from the story - forgiveness received is for passing on to others. This is what we pray each time we say the Lord's Prayer: "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Genuine forgiveness is from the heart. Today we are invited to act like people who are infinitely loved and infinitely forgiven by God. Sometimes our

hurts and burdens can be heavy to carry through life. To forgive can lighten some of the weight. Forgiveness, like love, is a mystery. It cannot be measured or counted. In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells us to forgive again and again so that our hearts may be enriched beyond all understanding.

ANTIPHON SHEETS

On the table just inside the church you find weekly Antiphon Sheets. At week-

day Masses please take one and join in the Entrance and Communion Antiphons. The Entrance Antiphon is said after the Priest genuflects, as he enters the Sanctuary. The Communion Antiphon is said after the bell rings to signify his reception of Holy Communion. The Antiphons are recited at these points in accord with the directions of the *Roman Missal*. The sheet also contains the Psalm response, and the Alleluia, to assist you in saying them. Please replace the sheets after Mass.
