# **TODAY'S MASS**

**First Reading:** in the original Greek 'wisdom' ('sophia') is a grammatically feminine noun, hence the references to 'she' and 'her' in this extract. This should not obscure that wisdom in the Old Testament is taken by Christians to refer to Christ. If we look for Christ we shall find him.

Psalm: a psalm expressing confidence in God's steadfast love and protection.

**Second Reading:** as we near the end of the liturgical year the Church's Lectionary gives us readings from St Paul's first Letter to the Thessalonians. In this extract Paul deals in some detail with the future destiny of those who believe in Christ, both those who have already died and those who are still alive.

**Gospel:** the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Bridesmaids (or, more accurately, Virgins). The bridegroom represents Jesus Christ, the Messiah; the virgins represent Christians who await the return of Christ. The bridegroom's delay alludes to the fact that Jesus has not returned as soon as many had hoped. The marriage feast symbolises the

But what does the oil represent? Faith? Love? Good works? The latter is most likely in view of Jesus urging his followers to let their light so shine that people will see their good works and glorify the Father in heaven (*Matthew* 5:16). Whichever is the case, the basic point is that the Christian disciple should be ready at all times to meet Christ.

## **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY** COMMUNION

These are the lay people who are commissioned by the Archbishop to assist the Ordinary Ministers (i.e. the priests and deacons) in administering Holy Communion both at Mass in Church and to the housebound in their home. We are in need of some more EMoHCs. According to Immensae Caritatis - the Vatican docu-

ment which instituted this ministry \_ such ministers 'must be persons whose good qualities of Christian life, faith, and morals recommend them'. They must have a 'devotion and reverence towards the most august sacrament of the Altar. No one is to be chosen whose appointment the faithful might find disquieting'.

If you can recommend a suitable person, please speak to Sr Dorothy or Fr David. Training will be given by Fr David, and the next diocesan commissioning is expected to be in February.

Meanwhile we thank Cathy Dickenson, our EMoHCs coordinator, and all those who help administer Holy Communion in this way.
