

ADMINISTRATION **OF HOLY** COMMUNION

As a consequence of the current flu epidemic we ask for your understanding if Holy Communion will not be administered under both kinds until further notice. That means that the Extraordinary Ministers will not Holy administer Communion from the chalice at weekday and Sunday Masses. А reminder goes out to all EMs to use the antiseptic lotions available on the credence tables on either sides of the Sanctuary before distributing the Sacred Hosts.

CONFIRMATION 2018

This is a reminder for all young persons in year 8 and above who wish to



receive the Sacrament of Confirmation celebrated on Saturday 30 June at 3pm to complete an application form (available at the back of the church) and return it to the Parish Office no later than Sunday 11 February.

CAR PARKING

The parking facilities on parish premises should only be used by 'authorised users'. 'Authorised users' are people visiting the church or parish premises.

As a concession, parents delivering and collecting children from school are

also permitted to use the car park. But parents visiting the schools for longer periods (e.g. for assemblies or meetings) are not permitted to use the parish parking facilities. Teachers at the schools are not permitted to use the car park.

Illegal use of the carpark results in authorised users being unable to park.

The parish caretaker, as part of his duties, is attempting to enforce the parking policy and he will continue to do so. It is our intention to rigorously enforce this policy and we will resort to clamping if necessary.

It is highly regrettable that the caretaker has been verbally abused when carrying out his duties. Such behaviour can only be condemned in the strongest possible terms.
