ARRANGEMENTS FOR VISITING THE CHURCH DURING LOCKDOWN

Unfortunately, it is not possible to hold public acts of worship, other than funerals, in churches since Thursday 5 November.

However, our church is open at certain times for private prayer and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

There are streamed Masses online (https://www.churchservices.tv/wimbledon), but not open to the public in the church, at the times shown below:

MONDAY -FRIDAY

10am & 6.30pm: live streamed Mass (church closed to parishioners) 10.30am - 12 noon: private prayer with Exposition (church open to all)

SATURDAYS

10am & 6.30pm: live streamed Mass (church closed to parishioners)

10.30 - 11am: Confessions, the church will be open to parishioners (subject to change in case of any directives from the Diocese)

SUNDAYS

10am & 8pm: live streamed Mass (church closed to parishioners)

There will be no private prayer or Exposition at weekends.

Funerals can take place in the church, but are limited to 30 people only, they will normally be live streamed.

Any time the church is open, there will be stewards on duty to ensure we observe the COVID safety practices.

EDGE HILL PLAYERS

Edge Hill Players are presenting a streamed Christmas entertainment from mid-December for parishioners to view on YouTube over the Christmas period. It will be an upbeat collection of Christmas carols and songs, together with cracker jokes, Christmas preparations etc., all in Christmassy costumes. We are also planning Zoom excerpts (in costume) of *A Christmas Carol*, and Dancers from Sacred Heart School.

There will be a family feel, with five talented families singing in groups, to remind us of the family ethos of Christmas. Children will feature, as it is very much their time of year. We will light the Advent candles one by one through the show. We hope the moving finale will be Katy Lees singing *O Holy Night* in the church to the accompaniment of the organ and the parish choir (socially distanced).

Ideas for Christmas preparation videos, which will appear between the main items, are: cracker pulling, present wrapping, present opening, card writing, Christmas decorating, mulled wine prepping, cake mixing, cake icing and wreath making.

The link to the final show will be on the *Edge Hill Players* website. Contributions must be submitted by Friday 4 December. The final show will be available from 7pm on Friday 18 December.

WEST BARNES SINGERS

Over the years many parishioners have sung with the *West Barnes Singers* or attended their concerts. WBS is a local choir that normally meets in Holy Cross Hall in Motspur Park.

It is a friendly choir and you do not need an audition to join. Music is provided. Members vary as to how much experience they have reading music, but all are encouraged to learn as they go along, aided by practice discs.

We normally put on three concerts a year. Our repertoire ranges from major works such as the *Messiah*, *Elijah* and *The Creation*, to lighter programmes in the summer, such as songs from the shows, Gilbert and Sullivan and gospel music.

In February 2020 we once again performed at Merton SingFest, which was a very enjoyable opportunity to meet with and listen to other choirs who sing in and around the borough. Also, each year in December we sing carols in Centre Court when we make a collection for a charity, in 2019 for the local charity Christian Care.

Sadly, COVID-19 forced us to cancel our concerts in March and June 2020. In September we resumed meeting, but on Zoom, and have been learning a Mozart Mass, and we hope to meet to sing it together before too long.
