Welcome!

My name is Fr Matthew Donnelly. I'm 51 years old and I was ordained to the priesthood on the 17th July 2021.

I was born and grew up in Lewisham, and before joining seminary at the age of 45 I worked as a Building Surveyor on many of the major new developments in South London.

I had a previous foray into training for the priesthood when I was 18, when I joined a religious community in Italy. After four years, I decided to leave and embark on a 'normal' life back in the 'world'. For a few years, I was engaged to be married and was leaning towards settling down with family.

But God kept calling, in unforeseen and surprising ways, and after a series of retreats and serious soul searching, my fiancée made the decision for me, and packed me off a 'late vocation' weekend. The rest, as they say, is history and I am eternally grateful to her for such magnanimity!

It really is a joy to begin my ministry with you here at Sacred Heart Wimbledon in this beautiful and awe-inspiring church with such a diverse and vibrant community.

Hello, I am Deacon Joseph Gulliford. I was born and bred in Welling, south-east London, blessed to belong to a strong and committed Catholic family. Growing up, we would often pray together, saying the rosary and giving God praise through song. A big contribution to the formation of my faith has also come from Catholic charismatic events like the 'Celebrate' family conference, which we attended every year, and the Sion Community (who I spent a year with after Sixth Form). I am a keen footballer and Spurs' fan, while I love writing songs and playing music, especially for worship.

Until my late teens, I never seriously considered a Priestly vocation. Perhaps it was always there in some way in the back of my mind, yet I only began to take notice of it at the end of my time with the Sion Community and into University life. The desire in my heart to become a Priest blazed up like a fire in my heart and got stronger by the day through my early twenties, even in spite of a very serious relationship with a woman I wanted to marry. God gave me the freedom to choose this vocation, but He also revealed to me that it would be where I would be most happy and fulfilled. Now, as a Deacon, I am happy to embrace this call and feel a deep peace and joy as I journey onto the Priesthood (next year). It is wonderful to be here in Sacred Heart Parish. I ask for your prayers as I take part in Parish ministry and finish my studies in Seminary, while I look forward to meeting you all throughout the year ahead. God bless you! Joseph

IN RELIGIOUS STUDIES (CCRS)

'Learn in person, by distance learning or online!'; the Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies is managed and awarded by the Board of Religious Studies on behalf of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales and was introduced to replace its predecessors, The Catholic Teachers' Certificate and the Certificate in Religious

Education. Any person who is or wishes to be involved in Catholic education and formation may apply for this course. This includes those involved in Religious Education in schools, Parish Catechesis and other ministries in the Church and anyone who wishes to follow course for faith development or personal interest. The course seeks to ensure that participants have at least a basic knowledge and understanding of the beliefs of the Catholic Faith. It also provides a basis for further study.
