Pastoral Letter for the Opening of the Synod

Archbishop John Wilson writes:

"[...] I encourage everyone in our Archdiocese to take part in the Synod by participating in their local parish process which will take place primarily over the next month. You can also participate by submitting a response directly online or in writing. Each parish is different, and we must be mindful of the challenges still presented by Covid 19; but please try to listen and reflect as widely as possible, including schools, people of all ages and backgrounds, and groups and organisations within the local community. I look forward to meeting with the parish delegates to hear what has emerged.

Allow me to finish by sharing again what I said when I became your Archbishop:

We have a hope in the Lord Jesus...These are the most important first words I could ever say to you. In the Lord Jesus we have a hope for our world, a world which God created, a world which God loves. In Him we have a hope for our common humanity which God shared by taking flesh and dwelling among us. In the Lord Jesus we have a hope for the Church, Christ's Body, called to announce the Gospel with confidence and joy. In Him we have a hope for each other, that our lives have a purpose, a dignity and a destiny, that we can live in love, with justice, for peace. We have a hope in the Lord Jesus, crucified and risen from the dead, alive in His Church, alive in His Word, alive in His Sacraments. Dear friends we have a hope in the Lord Jesus, alive in us by the power of the Holy Spirit.⁸ [...]"

SYNOD 2021-2023

The Holy Father launched the Synodal Process for the Universal Church last weekend, Pope Francis' homily can be found at https://www.vatican.va/content/ francesco/en/homilies/2021/ documents/20211010-omeliasinodo-vescovi.html.

This Sunday, 17 October at 10am, Archbishop John Wilson will launch the Synodal Process in Southwark with a livestreamed Mass at St George's Cathedral (<u>https://youtu.be/</u> <u>aiCHG9JuqaY</u>).

Here are just a few words from the Holy Father at the launch Mass: 'Let us have a good journey together! May we be pilgrims in love with the Gospel and open to the surprises of the Holy Spirit. Let us not miss out on the grace-filled opportunities born of encounter, listening and discernment. In the joyful conviction that, even as we seek the Lord, he always comes with his love to meet us first.'

POPE SAINT JOHN PAUL II NOVENA

On Friday 22 October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will receive its Second Reading, with full debate, in the House of Lords. If successful, it will enable terminally ill adults with less than six months to live, assistance to commit suicide.

From 14 - 22 October, in the lead up to the Second Reading, the bishops encourage the faithful to unite for nine days of prayer, seeking the intercession of Pope Saint John Paul II, as part of our efforts to help defeat this attempt to legalise assisted suicide. For many years in normal, non-lockdown, times, volunteers from the parish have been working for others, both in the parish and in the wider Merton community, in a wide range of ways.
