# The Marriage Feast at Cana

The first week in ordinary time launches us into the knitty gritty of Christian living by likening the spiritual life to the ups and downs of marriage.

Over Christmas we have witnessed the mystery of God becoming human; indeed, a child born into a human family, so that we could witness at first hand the model to which we should aspire.

In today's first reading God delights in Israel the daughter of Zion, as she grows in beauty and maturity just as a parent delight in the development of their offspring: the baby's first words, then the first steps until maturity and then marriage.

We see our personal journey reflected in the history of Israel, sometimes faithful, and at other times disobedient and unfaithful, needing guidance and growth in maturity until we are ready for the commitment to marriage.

We sometimes need to be disciplined and even estranged from our parents in order to know how much they love us and how willing they are to forgive and embrace us - they forsake us only so that we go back to them with ever deeper bonds of love. When we've learnt to show good will by amending our behaviour in the pursuit of goodness, as opposed to indulgence in selfish wants and desires, we achieve the mark of adulthood. This process of growth, sometimes painful, endows us with the capacity to make a responsible commitment to another person in love. In fact, the scriptures move beyond the analogy of the parent child relationship, to that of marriage in order to convey the depth of intimacy and love that God demands of us. As we grow in spiritual maturity, He desires the root of the human soul in nothing less than the permanent bond of marriage. Indeed, nothing less than the intimate bond of spouses, where the two become one flesh is the analogy adequate enough to convey the baptized person's potential for oneness and communion with God.

This week the Church calls to mind the great dignity of our Christian calling by presenting us with the marriage feast at Cana, at which Jesus performed His first public miracle; that of changing water into wine.

At one level, Christian marriage is a collaboration with God for the mutual enrichment of the spouses, ordered to the regeneration of humanity as Sons and daughters of God through Baptism.

At another, each and every Christian, whether married or not, is called to collaborate with Christ in a fruitful union as members of His body the Church. To be fruitful, Jesus needs our cooperation, we provide the water - in other words all that is good about our human nature and its expression in art, science, philosophy, politics and friendship - and he elevates it by transforming this base material into the supernatural life of God, symbol -lized by the wine in this gospel.

As spouses of Christ, we are called to share the richness of our union with others. We do this primarily by performing the works of love demanded by the gospel: the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. However, like children we sometimes resent having to

cooperate and share, and we tend to appropriate all the good that we have to ourselves. And yet, it's when we obey, and with faith, offer ourselves and our talents by doing what He tells us, that we are overwhelmed by His superabundance. As with all growth in our spiritual lives we need the Mother who generated Jesus in her womb, and by having generated Him she generates us through our Baptism. In fact, all we need to remember is Our Lady's admonition "do whatever He tells vou."

Today, 16 January, is Peace about?
