A Son Whom She Will Call Emmanuel

The underlying theme to this week's readings is the provenance of Jesus; where does he come from? and his identity; who is He?

Isaiah in the first reading makes the prophecy of Jesus' provenance and identity in revealing the great sign of God's coming into the world '...the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Emmanuel, a name which means God is with us'.

Mary, already knew of Isaiah's ancient 700-year-old prophecy, and rejoiced that the will of God was being fulfilled when the angel Gabrielle repeated it to her. By her being Immaculately conceived, God ordained that the divine nature of the person of the Word would gain access to the world by Mary's agreeing to become the Mother of God. What an incredible truth! Jesus' birth is miraculous and of divine origin. Joseph was not his biological Father, and this is what produced the doubt about Our Lady's fidelity in his mind. 'But being a just man and wanting to spare her publicity, he decided to divorce her informally.'

The meaning of Jesus identity was an enigma to many, but the people nevertheless recognised Joseph as his father and Mary his Mother. 'Is this not the Son of Joseph?' (Luke 4:22) A general misconception about the story of Mary and Joseph was corrected by St. John Paul II, that somehow Mary was unmarried when pregnant and therefore open to public condemnation because of an apparent infidelity. (Redemptoris Custos 18)

However, according to Jewish law, they were legally married at the time of Mary's pregnancy, even before coming together, because for the Jews a betrothal is the same as marriage and carries all the rights of marriage. The problem presented by the fact of Mary's pregnancy was one for Joseph, and that doubt being formed in his mind was his alone, not anyone else's. So even when other people saw that Mary was pregnant, they knew that she was married and therefore no scandal was given. Indeed, there was never an instance in Our Lady's life that the Devil could ever claim to have held sway over Our Lady, even in the minds of other people.

The gospel text itself clearly refers to Joseph as Mary's husband, and so assumes what they were lawfully married according to Jewish law in the sight of the people at the time Mary fell pregnant. Therefore, it was never within the realms of possibility that Our Lady could have been stoned as a public sinner, as some suggest. In fact, the dream given to Joseph which contained the same secret message - that what had been conceived in Mary's womb was done by the power of the Holy Spirit - resolved the whole question of doubt in Joseph's mind. It is both interesting and important to know that Jesus' provenance is rooted in the history of Israel; that His being God isn't separate from what has already been revealed about God in the Old Testament. protagonists in the gospel struggle with. 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven?' (John 6:42). They cannot fathom that Jesus is both one and the same Messiah of the House of David whose Kingdom will last forever, and the Second Person of the Trinity - the Word of God, Son of the Father.

We too can rejoice, like Our Lady, because we know for certain by the light of the Paschal faith that Paul refers to in the letter to the Romans, the answer to the question the true identity of Jesus and where He comes from. It is by the 'obedience of faith' as Paul puts it, in the light of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, that we can answer that question; the same question lesus Himself puts to his disciples, 'Who do the people say the Son of Man is', 'You are the Christ', we reply with Peter, 'Son of the living God'. (Mt 16:16).

Crib Appeal 2022 • Crib Appeal

This year's Parish Crib Appeal will be in support of **Care4Calais**, a volunteer run charity working with refugees in France, Belgium and the UK.

Their local team have been active since July 2020 and they have worked directly with those that arrive here searching for safety. Their services aim to meet the needs of those living without money, rights, or freedom of choice while waiting for a decision from the government about their status. After making an often-dangerous journey to the UK, 37000 individuals are currently restricted to their hotel rooms, with little ability to make decisions due to financial restraints and restrictions.

Imagine waking up every day not knowing if you will be moved and made homeless or taken to a deportation centre and sent to Rwanda. Unable to provide for your children, in some hotels a person may receive just £8 per week, to cover everything other than basic meals.

Support from charities is the only way these people can get through the months or even years of waiting to be granted asylum. **Care4Calais** has been overwhelmed with support from the local community, including donations in kind from the Sacred Heart parish.

They now provide additional food, clothing and activities that enhance mental health and wellbeing. They run board game nights, conversation classes, walking groups, yoga classes, cooking sessions and reading with children.

They ask now for your support to allow a little bit of happiness for refugees this Christmas.

They would not be able to do all this without your kindness and generosity, so thank you from the beneficiaries and from **Care4Calais**.
