Good Shepherd Sunday

The next great event we prepare for, following the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead, is Pentecost which this year falls on the 28th May.

The new reality of the Church left by Jesus after His Ascension and Resurrection finds its soul and expression when the apostles exercise their ministry to its fullest extent in fearlessly proclaiming the Resurrection from the dead and bringing those listening to faith by administering the new life of the risen Jesus through the sacraments. Indeed, Peter, the head of the college of the apostles, exhorts the people on the day of

Pentecost to repent and receive the sacrament of Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

The Holy Spirit quickens the soul of the Church today and will continue to do so by this continual cycle of proclaiming the Word, exhorting to repentance through sacramental confession, and administering the sacraments - first Baptism, the sacrament, reconciliation, the Eucharist, then Confirmation the seal of a mature disciple - these are the so-called Sacraments of Initiation. As at the very beginning of the life of the Church the work of evangelisation was accompanied by the Eucharist which feeds the soul of the Church: not a ritual gesture of something that happened in the past, but the extraordinary reality of the risen and glorified body of Jesus living for us today to be received in Holy Communion.

Today's second reading encourages us in the way of discipleship. Once having been initiated into the sacramental life of the Church, we are encouraged to take up the way of discipleship in collaborating with Jesus in His mission, which is the mission of the Church, to save souls - there is no other reason for the Church's existence than to bring us to eternal salvation. The sacraments enable us in our turn, to bring the same saving faith to others. This is what Jesus means by the 'sheepfold' in today's the gospel: to find ourselves within the sheepfold established by Christ - the Church, in order to lead others to salvation through Christ. This is our mission, that other people God has put in our way may pass through Him 'The Gate' into the Church, so that they too may enjoy the sacramental life of grace. There is no other reason for the Church than the communication of Christ's life to His faithful - those who having heard the Word, have repented, receive Baptism, and then nourish their faith on the living Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass - the living heart of the Church, so that we all may enjoy supernatural life and have it to the full.
