Fourth Sunday of Advent (B)

Day of prayer for Expectant Mothers

Sunday 24th December: 4th Sunday of Advent

(Saturday 6.30pm and Sunday morning Masses)

First Reading: God did not want King David to build him a house. However, God promised that David's house, his dynasty, will be established forever. Jesus is the fulfilment of that covenant, and was born in Bethlehem, the place where David was anointed (*I Samuel* 16).

Psalm: the second verse alludes to God's covenant with David related in the *First Reading*. The birth of Jesus Christ, in the house of David through Joseph, is the completion of this promise and covenant.

Second Reading: St Paul concludes *Romans* with a doxology, that is giving glory to Jesus Christ, who was kept "secret for endless ages" but who has now been revealed.

Gospel: as Christmas draws near Mary moves to centre stage, and today we hear the account of the Annunciation to Mary. *Luke* is emphatic that Mary, although betrothed to Joseph, was a virgin; this is known as the virginal conception (a better term than 'virgin birth').

Sunday 24th & Monday 25th: The Nativity of the Lord

(Sunday evening and Monday morning Masses)

Children's Christmas Crib Service at 3.30pm.

There are different Readings for the Vigil Masses (at 5.00pm and 7.30pm), the Midnight Mass (at Midnight), the Mass of the Dawn (at 8.00am), and the Mass of the Day (at 10.00am and 12.00 noon). Carols from 7.10pm before the 7.30pm Mass and from 11.30pm before the Midnight Mass. During the Creed all kneel at the words 'and became man'.

The **Gospel** at the Vigil Masses is the genealogy of Jesus in *Matthew*, outlining his ancestry to Abraham; it is meant to emphasise that although God he shares our human nature.

The **Gospel** at the Midnight Mass is from *Luke*, who takes great care to locate Christ's Incarnation at a particular place - Bethlehem - and at a particular date. Notice that the first to acknowledge Christ's birth are shepherds, poor people on the margins of society.

The Mass of the Dawn is sometimes called the Mass of the Shepherds because of the **Gospel** reading which continues the Bethlehem narrative started at the Midnight Mass and which focusses on the shepherds. Mary also has a special place, 'pondering these things in her heart'.

At the **Gospel** at the Masses of the Day we hear the great prologue of *John's* Gospel, a theologically rich explanation of the mystery of the Incarnation. The **Second Reading** from *Hebrews* is another classic text about God the Son.

NEXT SUNDAY

This is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We are expecting that there will be a Pastoral Letter from His Grace the Archbishop to be read out at Mass, in place of the Homily. The 8.00pm Mass next Sunday, however, being after first Vespers will be a Mass of Monday's Feast of Our Lady. It does count as your Sunday obligation.

MIDNIGHT MASS FOR THE NEW YEAR

At Midnight next Sunday we shall celebrate a special Mass for the New

Year; this will be a Mass of Monday's Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Come and dedicate the new year to God, and come and pray for peace in the world, especially in Israel and Palestine and in Ukraine. It also counts for your Sunday obligation. If you have previously attended Mass earlier on the Sunday you may receive Holy Communion again at this Mass.

MONDAY IST JANUARY (BANK HOLIDAY)

Mass at 10.00am only. No Confessions or 6.30pm Mass on a Bank Holiday.

SUNDAY 7TH JANUARY

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is observed next year on Sunday 7th, not the usual 6th January. Just to confuse everyone further, the Saturday evening Mass at 6.30pm will be the Epiphany Vigil Mass; this has different prayers from the Mass of the Day on the Sunday.

CHRISTMAS COLLECTION

By diocesan rule, the Christmas Collection is for the three priests of the parish. Along with the Easter Collection this forms a major part of their income, so Frs David, Matthew and Jackson thank you in advance for your generosity.

You can make a bank transfer for the Christmas Collection (to RCAS Wimbledon, 60-24-07, 33138672; please put *'Christmas Collection'* as the reference; the Parish receives the Gift Aid refund) or you can use either selection on the card readers.

CRIB OFFERINGS

The Christmas Crib is displayed in the St Ignatius Chapel. Please take care when lighting votive candles, especially if children are involved.

The Crib Offerings this year - in view of what is happening in Palestine and Israel - will be sent to the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, earmarked for medical and humanitarian needs, via Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, of which Fr David is a Knight Commander. This will ensure the aid gets to where it is most needed. It used to be unlawful in the UK to send aid to Gaza, but the government has temporarily suspended this, so our donation can be used to provide food, water, shelter and medicines to the people there, as well as elsewhere in the area.
