Today's Mass

First Reading (Acts 13:14,43-52): Paul and Barnabas suffer persecution at Antioch for preaching the Gospel, but succeed in converting many of the Gentiles (the non-Jews).

Psalm 99(100): If Christ is the Good Shepherd, that makes us 'the sheep of his flock'.

Second Reading (Apocalypse 7:9,14-17): In his vision, St John sees the heavenly hosts (to which we refer in the Sanctus: 'Holy Lord God of hosts'). This army of soldiers for Christ is innumerable - thus fulfilling the promise to Abraham - and taken from every nation, not just the Jews.

If Jesus is the lamb in the Second Reading, then in the Gospel (John 10:27-30), He is the Good Shepherd. Today is traditionally Good Shepherd Sunday, a day of prayer for religious vocations. This Gospel is also notable for Jesus' statement that 'I and the Father are one', a clear indication of His divinity as one of the Persons of the Holy Trinity. Canon David
