Today's Masses

Pentecost is a Day of Prayer for the Church, and is the last day of the fifty days of Easter.

The **Pentecost Vigil Mass** (6.30pm Saturday) - not as extensive as the Easter Vigil - offers us Old Testament Readings, followed by the traditional Pentecost Psalm 103(104). In the Second Reading (Romans 8:22-27), St Paul explains how the Spirit helps us in our weakness. When we hear the Gospel (John 7:37-39), we wait in vigil for the Holy Spirit, which we shall celebrate liturgically tomorrow.

In the Mass of the Day (all other Masses), the First Reading (Acts 2:1-11) is the famous account of Pentecost, which strikes terror into the hearts of Mass readers with all the names! Pentecost is one of the most momentous events in the history not just of the Church, but of the whole world. The day of Pentecost was the undoing of the tower of Babel.

After the Pentecost Psalm 103(104), in the Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13), the Baptized have various different gifts and perform various different activities and acts of service to the community of faith, but all are inspired by the one Holy Spirit.

The **Sequence** is obligatory at the Mass of the Day, and it should be sung if at all possible. The Gospel (John 20:19-23) follows: the risen Jesus Christ appears to the disciples behind locked doors. He 'breathed on them', an act evoking God's creative breath in Genesis 2:7, and this is linked to receiving the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins. The idea seems to be that whenever the disciples - and their ordained successors - forgive sins, at that moment, God forgives the sins and they remain forgiven, and on the last day, God will confirm the remission. Conversely, the unforgiven sins will be held fast until Judgment Day. Canon Wavid

Following the successful Safeguarding Sunday two weeks ago, the Parish Pastoral Team met with the Parish Safeguarding Team for an update and review on the parish's safeguarding procedures and protocols. Safeguarding: It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased.
