

From a letter of St Athanasius

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity, there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energising reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way, the unity of the Holy Trinity is preserved.



Today's Mass

The **First Reading** (Proverbs 8:22–31) portrays Wisdom as existing before Creation and as having assisted at Creation. Here, the Church has always understood Wisdom as referring to Christ, the second person of the Trinity.

Psalm 8: The psalmist praises the first Adam, who is 'little less than a god', but we pray the psalm to praise the second Adam, Christ, under whose feet all things will be put.

Second Reading (Romans 5:1–5): We can look forward to God's glory thanks to the work of Jesus and of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel (John 16:12–15): In His Farewell Discourse to the disciples, Jesus closely links the Father, the Son, and the Spirit of truth. The Son was charged with accomplishing the Father's work, but after Jesus' departure, the Spirit will lead the disciples in that mission.

Easter Communion

This Trinity Sunday is the last day to fulfil the fourth precept of the Church, which requires us to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season. The 'Easter Duty' is one of the three precepts of the Church that are binding obligations for Catholics. Receiving Holy Communion during this time is a way to connect with the Paschal Mystery, the central event of Christian faith, and to deepen one's spiritual life.

Day for Life

The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, the Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June. Inspired by Romans 5:5-6, this year's theme is: Finding Meaning in Suffering - Hope Does Not Disappoint. Christian hope is not naïve optimism, but an unshakeable trust in the power and presence of God who is with us always. This hope can endure the darkness of human suffering and see beyond it.
