Today's Masses

This Sunday is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. The 6.30pm (Saturday) Vigil Mass will hear different readings and prayers from those of the Mass of the Day on Sunday.

The First Readings at both Masses record significant miracles in the life of St Peter. At the Vigil Mass, we hear the healing of the man at the Beautiful Gate (Acts 3:1-10) while at the Mass of the Day, we hear of St Peter's liberation from prison (Acts 12:1-11). Both Saints Peter and Paul were imprisoned multiple times; Psalm 34(33) during the day is a response of thanksgiving to their releases.

At the Vigil Mass, Psalm 19(18) can be seen as describing the whole feast: 'Their sound goes forth through all the earth.' Peter travelled (to Rome) and wrote his letters, while St Paul spread the Good News of Jesus throughout the then-known world through his voyages and writings - writings excerpted in the Second Readings. At the Vigil Mass, Galatians 1:11-20 tells us from where Paul got the Gospel: through a direct revelation of Jesus Christ. At the Mass of the Day, 2 Timothy 4:6-8,17-18 is a poignant summary of Paul's mission.

We last heard the Gospel at the Vigil Mass (John 21:15-19) on the Third Sunday of Easter, when Jesus asked Peter 'do you love me?', eliciting the threefold affirmation of love by Peter and Christ's threefold command to 'feed my sheep'. The Gospel of the Mass of the Day (Matthew 16:13-19) is Peter's profession of faith and Christ's statement 'On this rock ...'. Both Gospels affirm the primacy of Peter and his successors as Pope.

On this Feast of the two Apostles who ended up and were martyred in Rome, it is very appropriate that we welcome the Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, His Excellency Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, to celebrate the 12 noon Mass. Canon Wavid

Many congratulations to parishioner Corrado Amari, who was recently invested as a Knight of the Order. Canon David has been appointed by Cardinal Filoni, Grand Master, as the new Prior of the Southwark Section.

Solar panels

Solar panels have been installed on the roof of the Upper Hall. As well as reducing the parish's environmental footprint, the panels will save on its energy bills and provide emergency lighting in the church, making it safer.

On their first day of operation, the panels generated 5.09kW of electricity, of which 0.97kW was used by the church lights and Presbytery, while 4.12kW was sold to the electricity supplier. The parish saved more than 11kg in CO2 emissions in a day.
