Today's Mass

First Reading: During the journey of the Israelites through the wilderness, led by Joshua, they fight Amalek and his army. They are victorious as long as Moses, who is watching from a height, can hold up his arms in prayer. Moses needs the help of Aaron and Hur to do this. The lifting up of arms and hands in the air is an ancient gesture of prayer, still used today. It is a physical illustration of the need for perseverance in prayer.

Psalm is a psalm of confidence in God, witnessing to God's faithfulness.

Second Reading: Paul reaffirms the message of his Letters to Timothy: stick with what you have been taught and study Scripture with discernment.

This Sunday's Gospel is a parable on prayer and the need for perseverance in prayer. Unlike the judge in the parable, God is not indifferent, and with God, justice is assured - but do we have enough faith to persist?

The **Memory Lane Club** is a friendly, lively, informal drop-in space, welcoming those in the local community affected by memory loss or dementia and their carers. We meet 10.30am to 12.30pm on Wednesdays in the Lounge.

Recommended by GPs right from its opening, this popular club has gone from strength to strength since it first opened its doors in March 2015. Run by volunteers, there is coffee, cake, chat, fun, laughter, and a varied programme of activities. Carers get the opportunity to meet and share experiences with other carers and volunteers, many of whom themselves have had personal experience of looking after a loved one with dementia.

If you are a carer of a loved one with dementia, we would be delighted to see you. Please do drop in on any Wednesday morning along with your loved one. Until Sunday 2 November Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles of St Carlo Acutis

Scam emails

The diocesan ICT team report a rise in scam emails targeting parishioners. These emails impersonate the parish priest, often using a similar email name and masking the real email address. They typically request the recipient to purchase Amazon or other gift cards as gifts for the priest. If you encounter these emails, please report them as spam and inform the Parish Office immediately. In particular:

- never purchase gift cards as gifts for – or requested by – a member of the Parish Pastoral Team;
- double-check any suspicious emails (contact the Parish Office if in any doubt); and
- do not share personal or financial information in response to unsolicited emails.


