Today's Mass

The Solemnity of All Saints - a Holyday of Obligation - is usually observed on 1 November - but this year, under the rules in England and Wales, the Solemnity is transferred to this Sunday.

As we enter the final month of the Church's year, we turn our attention to all the saints who live triumphantly in heaven, including those not in the canon (list) of saints. The Solemnity reminds us the Church Militant - of our unity with the communion of saints in heaven - the Church Triumphant. Meanwhile, All Souls' Day on Monday reminds us of our unity with the Holy Souls in Purgatory the Church Penitent.

First Reading (Revelation 7:2-4,9-14): St John, in his vision of heaven, sees the innumerable ranks of the saints, who have remained faithful to Christ even unto death.

Psalm 23(24): This hymn-like psalm sums up the virtues required to enter heaven: clean hands, a pure heart, and a desire for Godly things, not worthless things. This is one of the new Lectionary texts where more inclusive language is used.

Second Reading (1 John 3:1-3): This passage gives the hope that, as we are children of God, we too can be numbered among the saints in heaven.

Gospel (Matthew 5:1-12a): There are many different ways of understanding the Beatitudes, but one way is to see them as a list of entrance requirements to enter the kingdom of heaven: this includes humility, mercy, purity, and peacemaking. Many Christians in the world today, especially in parts of the Middle East and Nigeria, are suffering the persecution to which Christ refers.

Annual Mass Count

The average Sunday Mass attendance during this year's count period was 1,301. Last year's figure was 1,337, so our attendance is down by some 2.7%.

Next Sunday is the Solemnity of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. This Feast displaces the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time; musicians and readers at Mass, please take note.

It is also Remembrance Sunday. Canon David will represent the parish at the traditional Act of Remembrance at the Wimbledon War Memorial.

Next Sunday's **Second Collection** will be for the Archbishop's Appeal, which funds three key mission priorities: youth and evangelization, our faith in action, and clergy care and formation.

Saturday 1 – Sunday 9 November Plenary Indulgences

A Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls, may be gained once in church either on All Souls' Day (Monday 3 November), or on the preceding or following Sunday, on the usual conditions. These conditions are: visit a church, recite the Our Father and a Creed, receive sacramental Confession and Holy Communion, and pray for the Pope's intention.

Those who visit a cemetery between Saturdays 1 and 8 November and pray for the Faithful Departed may obtain a Plenary Indulgence applicable to the Holy Souls (and at other times a Partial Indulgence).

Monday: All Souls' Day

The transfer of the Solemnity of All Saints means that the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed is also transferred to the next day. Therefore, this year, All Souls' Day is this Monday. Requiem Masses for All the Faithful Departed will be celebrated at 8.00am, 10.00am, and 6.30pm.

7.00pm First Monday Adoration

Adoration will start promptly after the 6.30pm Mass. This time of community worship will be led by musicians from the Jesuit young adult community at No. 9 Edge Hill.

Come along and meet Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament with gentle music and guided prayer. On All Souls' Day, this is a special opportunity to come and pray for your loved ones who have departed.

There will be a short service outside the chapel at the Merton and Sutton Joint Cemetery (Garth Road, SM4 4NW). After the service, clergy of the Deanery will be available to bless individual graves of any relatives or friends of parishioners who are buried there or in the adjacent Morden (Battersea New) Cemetery.
