Today's Mass

The readings and proper prayers today very much focus our attention on the Second Coming of Christ.

First Reading (Malachi 3:19-20): The prophet Malachi portends the Day of Judgement. The arrogant and evildoers will be 'set ablaze', but those who fear the Lord will receive healing.

Psalm 97(98): We are manifestly near the end of the liturgical year, with this psalm's reminder that 'the Lord comes to judge the peoples with fairness'.

Second Reading (2 Thessalonians 3:7-12): As we await Christ's Second Coming, St Paul suggests that we should use the time well, quietly going about our business.

Gospel (Luke 21:5-19): Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, 'adorned with noble stones and offerings' as it was. It was destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. Jesus also foretells of the persecution His followers will experience - yet He counsels them not to be terrified or distracted, but to gain eternal life by their endurance. Canon David

The theme of the ninth World Day of the Poor is: 'You are my hope' (cf. Psalm 71:5). In Pope Leo XIV's message for the day, which you can read at tinyurl.com/3465wrfk, he says: 'It is my hope, then, that this Jubilee Year will encourage the development of policies aimed at combating forms of poverty both old and new, as well as implementing new initiatives to support and assist the poorest of the poor.' Entering a Care Home?

If you or a member of your family enters an Old People's Home or Care Home, please notify the Parish Office. We can arrange for the person to be visited or, if the home is in another parish, we can make a referral to the Parish Priest. The Parish Clergy, Sister Dorothy, Ministers of Holy Communion, and SVP members all visit the sick and housebound, but it is easy to accidentally or unknowingly miss someone out, so please do contact the Parish Office to let us know.

Safeguarding: It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger.
