Today's Mass

In the First Reading (Isaiah 7:10-14), Isaiah foretells the Messiah's virgin birth. While much scholarly ink has been spent debating this prediction, especially whether the original Hebrew really means 'virgin', it is perfectly acceptable for us to interpret it as Matthew does in the Gospel. The prophet rebukes King Ahaz for entering into an alliance with foreign powers instead of placing his trust in God, but God will send this sign to ensure that David's dynasty endures.

The man referred to in verses 2 and 3 of Psalm 24(23) is often taken to refer to King David, bringing the Ark into Jerusalem.

The Second Reading (Romans 1:1-7) is from the beginning of St Paul's letter to the Church in Rome. The good news is that Jesus, a 'descendant of David', is both human and divine.

Gospel (Matthew 1:18-24): Matthew depicts God's preparations for the birth and explains how this fits within Scripture, quoting the verse from Isaiah in today's First Reading. Notice how prominent Joseph is in this story: God takes the initiative in offering his grace, but we humans must make an active response.

While 'virgin birth' is often used, a more accurate term to designate Jesus' birth is 'virginal conception'. Emphasised by both Matthew and Luke, it helps us to understand Jesus as divine, the Son of God, but also as the long-anticipated Messiah, born into the house of David (to which Joseph belonged).
