Our media has been full of images of the tower block, and the stories of the many families made homeless by the fire, who are having to deal also with the loss of family members unable to escape the flames. The material loss of their homes and possessions is nothing to compare with the loss of their family and friends. We would normally have a collection today for the work of the Bishop's Conference in
