The Mustard Seed

A few years ago on a trip to the Holy Land the guide stopped the coach on a country After foraging road. around for few minutes he returned to the coach with a handful of tiny seeds. These mustard seeds which he handed round for us to see. He then pointed to a large bushy tree just near the edge of the road which was a full grown mustard tree. The parable of Jesus which we read in the gospel this weekend came to life for us. The mustard seed is tiny and it is hard to imagine that it will grow into such an impressive bush. It is not surprising that the full grown mustard tree is taken as a symbol of



the Church world wide. Here is a place of shelter and security for all who follow Jesus Christ. Here is where our faith is deepened and our experience of community confirmed. This short parable of lesus about the Mustard Seed offers us hope and assurance.

One of the ways the Church offers that growth in faith is through sharing with our children and young people the gift of the Eucharist. We are presently collecting the
